

Sub: Execution of Bond by candidates, while taking admission to Certified Ophthalmic Assistant (COA) &Certified Surgical Ophthalmic Assistant (CSOA) courses in the State.

Whereas there is a dearth of Ophthalmic Assistants in the State and there are not sufficient Ophthalmologist in the state to serve to fulfil the objectives of National Programme for Control of Blindness, like to reduce the backlog of blindness through identification and treatment of blind, to develop Eye Care facilities in every district, to develop human resources for providing Eye Care Services, to improve quality of service delivery in the field of Ophthalmology and to secure participation of Voluntary Organizations in eye care;

Whereas the training of Ophthalmic Assistants (COA or CSOA) has already been started in the state to address to the dearth of Ophthalmic Assistants in the State; and

Whereas there is also a reluctance to serve for the state after passing out;

Now therefore after careful consideration Government have been pleased to introduce a policy for execution of an agreement in shape of Bond with the objective to retain the passing out Ophthalmic Assistantsfor utilising their services as well as more skill development in the field in the greater interest of the State.

This resolution shall be effective from the date of notification.

1. The Bond conditions shall be as follows:

- a. Bond shall be applicable for all candidates taking admission in Government Institutions taking admission in the Certified Ophthalmic Assistants or Certified Surgical Ophthalmic Assistantscourses.
- b. No admission of any kind shall be done without submission of Bond and shall be ensured by DMET, Odisha.
- c. After completion of any of the above courses, the candidates shall have to joinin any health institution of the state, for more skill development in field while giving service for one year. They shall be paid a stipend of Rs. 6000/- (Rupees six thousand) only per month or as may be notified by Government from time to time.

- d. After completion of one year as per bond provision, the pass out candidates will be released from bond condition.
- e. In case a candidate gets opportunity for higher study immediately after completion of course, the bond seizes to operate and will come in to force after return from study. They shall submit a declaration in form of affidavit before JMFC as per format enclosed in **Appendix-1**, to that effect. In such cases the Pass certificate and CLC shall be released. Copy of such affidavit shall be sent to DHS and DMET Odisha.
- f. State Government reserves the right to give order of placementor not. In case no orderis given by State Government, within six months of completion of course the students shall be released from bond conditions and the bond lapses.
- g. Monetary Penalty for defaulters (for not joining in statefor one year after completion of course) shall berupees five lakh. The Pass Certificates, College Leaving Certificate or any other certificate in custody of authority shall be retained and will be released only after compliance to the provisions in bond.
- h. Candidates leaving the course before completion of the course leading to lapse of a seat shall be liable formonetary penalty of Rs. onelakh.

2. Procedure for execution of bond and its follow up:

- a. The bonds are to be prepared on non judicial stamp paper of Rs. 21 and will not be registered.
- b. The bond should be signed by the candidate, two sureties (parents / guardian) and the Dean & Principal / Head of the Institution of the concerned institution.
- c. Bonds shall be collected centrally at the time of provisional admission by the selection committee, and to be handed over to respective institution after final admission.
- d. After completion of course the copy of bonds shall be transmitted to DHS
 & DMET, Odisha, for reference during placement.
- e. All the candidates shall submit the bond in the format annexed at Annexure A.

completion of the said course. WHEREAS the Above Principal Obligor is placed on admission into Ophthalmic Assistant Course (COA /CSOA)andadmissible by the Government;
AND WHEREAS for better protection of the healthcare of the Government in the State, the Principal Obligor has agreed to execute this bond with such condition as hereunder written; AND WHEREAS the said surety has agreed to execute this bond as surety for
the discharge of the above burden of the amount of five lakh for two years of studyby the Principal Obligor
NOW THE CONDITION OF THE ABOVE WRITTEN BOND is that in the event of successful learning and completion of Ophthalmic Assistant Course (COA /CSOA) and obtaining registration there of the Principal Obligor
Appointment under the State Government after successful completion of Ophthalmic Assistant Course (COA /CSOA) shall be given to join a post for skill development as well as render service. Once an appointment is given, the candidate shall have to join within 30 days from the date of receipt of the appointment order failing which, he /she will be required to pay the amount as mentionedabove.
Further in the event of leaving the course due to any reason before the completion of Ophthalmic Assistant Course (COA /CSOA), leading to lapse of a seat, the Principal Obligoris liable for refund of an amount of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees onelakhs) to the Government of Odisha.
AND UPON in Principal Obligor
and the surety/sureties as aforesaid making such refund, the above

Sureties jointly and severally in the form of public demand under the Odisha Public Demand Recovery Act, 1962(O.A 1 of 1963).

Save and except death, permanent disability or selection for higher study under no circumstances, the Principal Obligor can forgo the appointment and if it so happens, he shall be liable to refund the money amounting to the amount equivalent to Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees five lakh) for twoyears of study.

Provided further that, in case of selection for higher study this bond will be seized to be operative till the study is completed and will be deemed to be in force on the date of completion of higher study and accordingly, all the above mentioned clauses will be in operation for all purposes.
